## REPORT OF AGM

The third Annual General Meeting of the Society held on 7th November at St. Barnabas Church Hall was attended by approximately 100 members. The Committee was confirmed in office for the coming year, no new nominations having been received. Grateful thanks were expressed to the newsletter distributors for their continued service and some additional volunteers were recruited. A discussion then took place on future activities; the Newsletter; aircraft noise; and on a proposal of the Borough Council to develop allotment land for housing (see below).

The extended discussion on the last item most unfortunately delayed the start of the record recital of Viennese music presented by Mr. A.J. Skinner. Those who were able to stay very much enjoyed his selection of music and voices.

## BRUNSWICK ROAD ALLOTMENTS

The meeting was unanimously opposed to the proposed housing development. Two resolutions were passed and have since been forwarded to the Council: (1) deprecating any proposal that would involve demolition of property in a conservation area; (2) opposing this particular scheme.

A sub-committee was set up to consider action. Although the proposals are at an early stage, it was felt that our views would have most effect if they are made known before Councillors and Council Officers are committed to the project. The view of the Society is that this land should remain an open space, although not necessarily only for use as allotments.
