BRENTHAM BOOKLET

The new illustrated booklet about the history and architecture of the Brentham Estate has now been published. Entitled "Brentham, Ealing's Garden Suburb", it traces the history of the Estate from its beginnings in 1901 as a co-operative housing venture to its designation by the Borough Council as a Conservation Area. In addition, there is an interesting section about the buildings and architectural ideas that lay behind the planning of the Estate, and which highlights the importance of Brentham as part of the garden suburb movement.

The booklet, which has been compiled by Bernard Johnson, is fully illustrated with both line drawings and photographs (some of historical interest). Copies can be obtained from any of the Society's Committee Members, price 90p, or from Ealing Books (opposite the Broadway Station).

TREES
