EALING BOROUGH PLAN & CONSERVATION ON BRENTHAM

Residents may be interested to know that the owner of a property in Fowlers Walk has been taken to court by the London Borough of Ealing for replacing his roof tiles with totally unacceptable pantiles on the side extension to his house. Please therefore, before you contemplate the replacement of any roof tiles, speak to the London Borough of Ealing Planning Department to ensure that what you are proposing will be acceptable.

BRENTHAM CLUB

A meeting has taken place between members of the Society's Committee and the Chairman and Secretary of the Brentham Club. The meeting was very amenable and at the present time we are agreeing a joint statement with them which will be publicised in the next Newsletter.
