THE TREES

The ceremonial tree planting on February 13th was attended by about 100 people - the planting programme is now virtually completed. Of the 89 trees planted, 80 are the first choice but some alterations had to be made owing to shortage of stock, notably the Cockspur thorns.

"Men of the Tree" are donating £60 for an oak to be planted on the Denison Road/Ludlow Road green in agreement with Bradford Property Trust. We planned a coppice of 3 trees, one an oak and two others - hawthorns have been suggested but we are open to other suggestions from residents bordering the green. Planting will take place next autumn.

Adopters are still needed. Nothing very difficult to do - no watering till June or July; in the meantime you just check that the tree and stake are firmly in place and the straps are secure. If you think your tree is not thriving, please call Brian Gould at the Town Hall (579 2424, Ext 52596).

Surplus funds are being offered to St Barnabas' Church to replant their hedge along Denison Road - we shall keep a small reserve in hand for future contingencies.

If you have not already volunteered to be an 'adopter', please contact Audrey Jones (997 9640) - it would be such a pity if the trees we have paid so much for should die of neglect. And please carry on collecting Target Bonds from the Ealing Gazette.

The Council has decided to enter this estate for the 'London Garden in Bloom Competition'.

ASBESTOS

A resident was recently concerned to find that panelling he was removing from a stair spandrel was made of asbestos cement. This substance is quite harmless when undisturbed but particles of it could be harmful if breathed in in sufficient quantities and over a period of time; therefore in case you are considering the removal of flush panelling in your house, we list a few commonsense precautions which should still further reduce the very small element of risk inherent in this operation.

- 1) Check on whether your panel is plywood, hardboard or asbestos by exposing a small area with a screwdriver or similar tool. If it is asbestos cement....
- 2) Wear a simple dust mask obtainable at most D.I.Y. shops.
- 3) Lay polythene dust sheets on carpets in the vicinity of the work.
- 4) Avoid breaking the panels if possible and thoroughly damp down exposed surfaces.
- 5) Carefully place all the pieces and the dust sheets in sealed plastic bags for disposal.
- 6) Wipe down all painted surfaces in the vicinity with a damp cloth.
