CABLE TV

Cable TV is here - whether you want it or not. We have received a number of complaints about (a) disruption to the footways and (b) the siting of relay boxes.

As far as the footways are concerned, Videotron's contractors, Fitzpatrick, are carrying out the work which is inspected by the council's representatives to ensure that the finished work is to an acceptable standard. Where cable is run under bit-mac there is scarring, and we have been told that this will fade with time.... If you have any complaints about the standard of work you can contact the Borough Liaison Officer (Cable TV) Mr. Parry on his direct line: 758 5548.

The committee have received a number of complaints about the siting of the relay boxes and we have written to the Borough Engineer requesting a meeting with all the people who are involved in this work. We will keep you informed of our progress. In the meantime, you can telephone Mr. Parry if you have a personal query. Also, please let any committee member know if you have any comments so that we can raise problems at our forthcoming meeting.

GENERAL STATE OF FOOTWAYS

In 1989 Audrey Jones walked the entire estate with a representative from the Borough Engineer's Department. We asked for bit-mac to be returned to slabs wherever possible and in the meantime for repairs to be carried out, both for safety reasons and to improve the appearance of patchy areas. We were informed that certain works might be possible if and when funds were available and some minor repair work was carried out at that time. Following recent complaints about the general deterioration of footways (particularly in Denison Road) we contacted the department again. Denison Road was assessed on a "points" system to see if it rated repair or resurfacing. We have been informed that it does not and since there has been a cut in the budget we cannot expect any work to be carried out in this budget year.
